TERM ONE SCHOOLS RUGBY PROGRAM VISIT REPORT

Our visit to Markham commencing on the 28th – March – 16th April was a success.

SCRUM staff conducted a 2 day skills workshop for 30 participants who were teachers and community youth leaders.

12 schools were identified elementary and primary. 200 students attended our session each day.

2 classes of elementary and 2 classes of primary school children.

Total number of children who participated in the program was 2400- an impressive number.

Term one rugby expo was cancelled due to fighting amongst the villages along the Markham Highway and schools are still closed along the Highway.

Markham District has the potential to develop the code of rugby in Schools and we've seen some potential rugby players both girls and boys form the schools we visited. It has been well received, we just have to continue our program to keep the interest there.

Term two program concentrated on the Lae urban schools and Huon Gulf District School.
