Robin Tarere - 20 years with SCRUM



MOROBE Rugby Coaching & refereeing course.

Took place May 13th – 15th. St Paul's Primary & SCRUM Oval here in Lae.

The new era of coaching provides coaches with information to basically understand the role of the coach, how to develop positive relationships with players, develop strategies to manage player's behaviour and how to develop your own coaching philosophy and how it impacts on the players.

Participants were also given a run down on how to divide the skills into meaningful phases and develop

an observation plan to analyse the key factors of a skill.

The WRB have set criteria for coaching accreditation and all coaches at Junior, Club, Provincial or National level are now able to go through this accreditation system to attain their coaching accreditation.

The Rugby Coaching Course has been developed to provide coaches with a basic understanding of the game of rugby. The resource is directed at coaches of teenage grades (Under 14 - Under 17).

It includes a comprehensive manual focusing on the skills of rugby as well as providing basic information on teaching a skill and the practical implications of rugby training.

This course was run by PNG Rugby Development Manager Sailosi Druma in conjunction with World Rugby and was assisted by local coordinator, and SCRUM's very own Robin Tarere.

20 Coaches and Teachers attending just completed the rugby ready course before attending the Level one Coaching and Rugby Ready Refereeing courses.

The Rugby Ready & Refereeing Topics covered:

- Principles of refereeing / understanding the role of the referees
- Awareness and safety issues for players
- Laws of the game and practical refereeing

LEVEL ONE COACHING Topics covered:

- Overview of the Game
- Principles of rugby coaching
- Role of the coach
- Introduction to skill analysis/ Planning & Group Organization
